
A MUSICAL ESSAY ON THINGS TO COME


This essay contains a selection of songs I have written on the topic of Heaven and things to come. These are from the collection of over 500 scriptural and devotional songs that I have written and used extensively, both personally and in my ministry.

I'm thinking of the songs as seeds. I have mixed them with brief commentary, hoping that a good crop of hope, encouragement, peace and joy will grow up in you as you contemplate these words. May God, the Source of Music, receive the glory.

I had no problem choosing the song I wanted to be first in this essay! 1 Corinthians 2:9,10 tells us that God has prepared for those who love him marvelous things that our human minds could not possibly imagine. BUT the Holy Spirit, who understands the deep things of God, is able to REVEAL to us what we cannot figure out on our own. While we are awaiting the time when our eye will see and our ears will hear, let's enjoy this time of anticipation. Something wonderful is going to happen!



While we are waiting, we have work to do. Here is a song, based on Matthew 6:19-21 that speaks of living life on two levels: simultaneously going about our jobs and laying up treasure in Heaven. I consider this to be a country-style song, with guitars and maybe an accordion used to accompany the singing. What do you think?



We who believe in our Lord Jesus Christ can face the future with confidence. Whether we do so or not depends on 1) our knowledge of what is to come, as revealed in the Bible and 2) our attitude toward these things, based partly on our personalities, but mostly on how much time we spend thinking about them. I believe suitable tunes help to fix scriptural truths in our minds, and from there, as we review them over and over again mentally, they make their way into our hearts.

Here are the things to come that we need to think about, and that are the subjects of the following songs:

- Death and our attitude toward it.
- The certainty that Jesus is going to return to the air some day to take his faith family home to him. The believers alive when that happens will never experience death, but they WILL be changed: their bodies will be turned into resurrection bodies. Meanwhile, the believers who have died, and are returning with Jesus, will receive their resurrection bodies. Then TOGETHER we will move to our heavenly home, where we will live forever. This event is commonly called the rapture.
 - Heaven, as not only a happy place, but a place where things happen!

Here, now, are the rest of the songs. I consider this next one, entitled The Ascension, to be the first hymn I ever wrote. With its four part harmony, its four verses, and the Amen at the end, I think it would fit right into any hymnal.





There was no doubt in his mind that to be with Christ in Heaven was better BY FAR; it was pure gain for him! Yet staying on this earth would benefit others by giving him opportunities to serve them. After quite a struggle, he became content with the knowledge that he would remain on earth a while longer.

In both songs my words mingle with Paul's, as I find his attitude appealing.






Here are some words of encouragement for us to live by on the earth:



I love the 15th chapter of 1 Corinthians, which ends with Paul's explanation of the defeat of death.


