7 RECORDED SAYINGS OF JESUS FROM THE CROSS With Commentary

1. "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing."

Amazing grace! Jesus was gracious while he was dying as he had been all through his life. Imagine forgiving those who put him on the cross! Jesus never runs out of forgiveness – even today.

2. "I tell you the truth, today you will be with me in paradise."

Jesus made this promise to the dying criminal who had humbled himself and asked for mercy. The salvation that Jesus offered to all who would believe in him throughout his ministry was still being offered while he was dying. Thank God, it is still available today!

3. "Dear woman, here is your son." "Here is your mother."

From the cross Jesus noticed his mother, Mary, and John, his beloved disciple. They would miss him when he was gone. Jesus told Mary to consider John to be her son now; he asked John to treat Mary as though she were his mother. That very day John took Mary into his household. Jesus cares about our needs too, and asks us to help each other.

4. "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

Out of the darkness – the <u>midday</u> darkness – came this loud, heart-wrenching cry, the high point of his agony. Jesus knew the answer to his question, for it had been written long before by King David: "But you are holy." Too holy to even look at Jesus while he was bearing our sins in his body on the cross.
