A HIGH CALLING

LET'S

Romans 13:12-14 — The night is nearly over; the day is almost here. So <u>let us</u> put aside the deeds of darkness and put on the armor of light. <u>Let us</u> behave decently, as in the daytime, not in orgies and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and debauchery, not in dissention and jealously. Rather, clothe yourselves with the Lord Jesus Christ, and do not think about how to gratify the desires of the sinful nature.

Romans 14:19 — Let us make every effort to do what leads to peace and to mutual edification.

2 Corinthians 7:1 — Since we have these promises, dear friends, <u>let us</u> purify ourselves from everything that contaminates body and spirit, perfecting holiness out of reverence for Christ.

Galatians 5:25 — Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit.

Galatians 6:10 — Therefore, as we have opportunity, <u>let us</u> do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers.

Philippians 3:16 — Let us live up to what we have already attained.

Hebrews 4:14-16 — Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has gone into heaven, Jesus the Son of God, <u>let us</u> hold firmly to the faith we profess. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weakness, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are – yet was without sin. <u>Let us</u> then approach the throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find help in our time of need.

Hebrews 6:1-3 — <u>Let us</u> leave the elementary teachings about Christ and go on to maturity, not laying again the foundation of repentance from acts that lead to death, and of faith in God, instructions about baptisms, the laying on of hands, the resurrection of the dead, and eternal judgment. And God permitting, we will do so.

Hebrews 10:22-24 — <u>Let us</u> draw near to God with a sincere heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled to cleanse us from a guilty conscience and having our bodies washed with pure water. <u>Let us</u> hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds.

Hebrews 12:1-2 — Since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, <u>let us</u> throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles, and <u>let us</u> run with perseverance the race marked out for us. <u>Let us</u> fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.

Hebrews 12:28,29 — Since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, <u>let us</u> be thankful, and so worship God acceptably with reverence and awe, for our God is a consuming fire.

Hebrews 13:12-16 — Jesus suffered outside the city gate to make the people holy through his own blood. <u>Let us</u>, then, go to him outside the camp, bearing the disgrace he bore. For here we do not have an enduring city, but we are looking for the city that is to come. Through Jesus, therefore, <u>let us</u> offer to God a sacrifice of praise – the fruit of lips that confess his name. And do not forget to do good and to share with others, for with such sacrifices God is pleased.

1 John 4:7 — Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God.

Revelations 19:7,8 — <u>Let us</u> rejoice and be glad and give him glory! For the wedding of the Lamb has come, and his bride has made herself ready. Fine linen, bright and clean, was given her to wear. (Fine linen stands for the righteous acts of the saints.)

Proverbs 3:5,6 — Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make your paths straight.

LET'S NOT

Romans 14:13 — <u>Let us stop</u> passing judgment on one another. Instead, make up your mind not to put any stumbling block or obstacle in your brother's way.

1 Corinthians 10:7-10 — <u>Do not</u> be idolaters, as some of them were; as it is written: "The people sat to eat and drink and to indulge in pagan revelry." <u>We should not</u> commit sexual immorality, as some of them did – and in one day twenty-three thousand of them died. <u>We should not</u> test the Lord, as some of them did – and were killed by snakes. And <u>do not</u> grumble, as some of them did – and were killed by the destroying angel.

Galatians 5:26 — Let us not become conceited, provoking and envying each other.

Galatians 6:9 — <u>Let us not</u> become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up.

- 1 Thessalonians 5:5-8 We do not belong to the night or to the darkness. So then, <u>let us not</u> be like others, who are asleep, but <u>let us</u> be alert and self-controlled. For those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who get drunk, get drunk at night. But since we belong to the day, <u>let us</u> be self-controlled, putting on faith and love as a breastplate, and the hope of salvation as a helmet.
- 2 Thessalonians 2:1 Concerning the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and our being gathered to him, we ask you, brothers, not to become easily unsettled or alarmed by some prophecy, report or letter supposed to have come from us, saying that the day of the Lord has already come. Don't let anyone deceive you in any way...

Hebrews 10:25 — <u>Let us not give up meeting together</u>, as some are in the habit of doing, but <u>let us</u> encourage one another – and all the more as you see the Day approaching.
